

We are nearing the mid term point and all classroom programmes are now in full swing. As Principal, I'm in the privileged position of being able to visit classrooms each day and witness the rich learning that is going on. As you will be aware, there is a nationwide move to improve the attendance rates of a number of tamariki. As a country, our levels of regular attendance fall significantly below those of other countries. This year, for the first five weeks of the year, our school rates have risen to over 86% attendance on any given day. We've been really pleased with this increase but there is still work to be done. As the weather starts to get colder and wetter, it is still very important that your child attends school unless they are unwell. Children learn best when they receive repetitive instruction every day. We, as a school, will continue to work closely with the community on ensuring our children get the best possible start they can to their education.



Yesterday when the weather was wet, daily attendance dropped by 10%, this is 65 students - the equivalent of more than two full classes away. Please remember that rain is not a reason to keep your children home from school.
