Last week we hosted visitors from Japan and Canada. Our Japanese visitors were teacher trainees from Tokyo. The athletes have been wonderful role models for our children and events like the Olympics provide great opportunities to show children what the Knighton Way values and dispositions look like. This includes looking at ways that we deal with elation or success as well as disappointment.
