The Ministry of Education allocated all schools two 'Accord Teacher Only Days' in 2024 and a further two 'Accord Teacher Only Days' in 2025. A letter about this Teacher Only Day will go out to the community soon.

Another friendly reminder that it is compulsory for all ākonga/students to wear a Knighton Normal School **Blue Hat** this term. This is part of our Sun Smart Policy. Please ensure your child has a KNS Blue Hat at school and that it is named. Thank you for your cooperation with this.
