Over the summer break we farewelled Nenehu Hughes who was a kaiāwhina in Te Hihiri. We also welcomed three new support staff, Matua Vahnz, Lauren Bain and Rui Paki.

Cell phones

Bikes and Scooters

- If your child brings a skateboard, bike, scooter or roller blades to school please ensure they are clearly labelled with your child's name so they can be easily identified.
- Bikes should be locked to the bike stand opposite the Literacy Centre/swimming pool.
- Scooters should be put in the racks at the back of room 9, opposite the junior book room.
- Skateboards, scooters, bikes and roller blades are <u>not</u> to be ridden in the grounds or on pathways at any time.
- Scooters and bikes etc are brought to school at the owner's risk.

Reminders

- → Change of clothes: Please make sure your child has a change of clothes in their school bag, they may get wet and muddy playing on the field in the break times, or have a toileting accident.
- → Medication: A reminder that a consent form must be filled in and left at the school office for any medication administered at school. A consent form can be downloaded from our website www.kns.ac.nz or collected from the office. All medication remains in the office for safekeeping during the day.
- → Our school has a No Sweets and No Nuts policy. Please refrain from including these items in your child's lunches.
- → We are a Water Only school. Please encourage your child to bring a drink bottle filled with water and to drink regularly during the day.
- → At 10am daily the children have a Brain Break in the classroom. Appropriate low sugar, healthy snack foods could be, a piece of fruit, vegetable sticks, yoghurt, or a small sandwich.

Around the School Grounds

We are fortunate to have large, beautiful grounds and lots of places to play at our kura. Mr Steve, our caretaker, does an amazing job looking after the place. You will see him most mornings with the leaf blower keeping the walkways clear.

Mrs Gardner Ward and her room 2 students are responsible for the beautiful flower barrels outside the office and the year 4 classrooms.

Students in year 4 can be involved with Envirokids led by Miss Brydon. They take care of the māra kai growing fruit and vegetables. Some of this goes to the Hauora Hub for students who need help with kai. This supports the generous regular donation of food for children's lunches by Sam Waddell, the owner of Four Square, Clyde Street. If you have fruit trees at home and have spare fruit the Hauora Hub are always grateful for donations.
